I should like to support the application for
the erection of a single storey 1-bed house
at the rear of 17 Boscastle Road.

The design and size of the proposed building
is, I think, most exciting and ingenious, using
interesting and high quality materials and
arrangement particularly successfully to be seen
from above. The courtyards created by the
interlocking buildings will provide exterior
space and garden without taking up too
much space from the old garden and, perhaps more
importantly, without overlooking it.

I do not think that this design will
have a deleterious impact upon neighbouring
buildings or land for the following reasons:

1. It lies at the end of the lane leading to
Grove Terrace Mews rather than at the end of any
of the Terrace gardens & thus will not be in their
direct line of view.
2. The neighbouring Boscastle Road houses will be
barely affected. No. 19 lies to the North & already

has a high wall obscuring its view of No. 17. No. 15 lies to the south so that the south side of the projected one storey building would only cast shadow very late in the evening & in any case would not be much higher than the existing garden wall. There will, therefore, be hardly any loss of light. Any gardener would be delighted to have a walk to the North of a garden on which to grow climbing plants & or fruit trees such as apricots or peaches.

The access for disabled people will be greatly facilitated, which is indeed one of the needs of the Gladstones, one of whom is seriously disabled. The private rather than public road will considerably increase his safety.

I know there will be concern about setting a precedent by building on gardens between Grove Terrace and Boscastle Road but there is one glaring inconsistency in that No. 3 Grove Terrace has what amounts to a garden shed not much smaller and certainly more awkwardly placed than No. 17 that is listed grade one and therefore a permanent fixture. I realise that this grading is due to the fact that this was Bartlet's studio where he committed suicide. It, therefore, has historic value but not, I would suggest, aesthetic or design value. The projected design for 17 Boscastle Road does have aesthetic and design value.
