Officer's Response

- 1. Initially an application was put forward for the proposed fascia sign solely, but the description was expanded to encompass the retention of the projecting sign also when it became clear that this sign was not regularised. So retrospective permission is sought under this application for the retention of the projecting sign.
- 2. The roller shutter is shown on existing and proposed drawings for accuracy as the present situation on site is that it is in place. It does not however form a part of this advertisements consent application, as it would need Full Planning Permission, and so is not under consideration here. It will continue to be investigated under the enforcement case with reference EN15/0820, which is seeking its removal.
- 3. Again the A-Boards that it was established are present on site (via a site visit) do not form a part of this advertisements consent application and so are not being regularised here. A highways enforcement case has been lodged to tackle their placement on the highway.

Recommendation:- Grant advertisement consent
