Proposal: Details required by condition 22 (cycle storage) of planning permission 2012/5552/P dated 22/03/2013 for the redevelopment of eastern part of Maiden Lane Estate following the demolition of Nos 1-55 and 2-16 Maiden Lane and the North Western Industrial Estate to provide 10 new blocks including a 20 storey residential tower and 9 mixed use blocks of 3-7 storeys incorporating 265 units of class C3 residential, classes B1/A1/A3/A4/D1 uses and a new energy centre, together with cycle parking and increased and improved areas of public realm and landscaping.
