Two photos which I sent to Emily Whittredge on 15 March should be viewed in conjunction with this objection. This is the only way you will see how close the proposed construction would be to my flat on the 4th floor of 44 Hatton Garden. This is because the developers have failed to provide any diagrams containing measurements showing the extent of the construction, or any side-view in relation to the neighbouring buildings that would demonstrate the height of the proposed construction and its encroachment into our access to light. (I was told such documents were forthcoming but they are nowhere to be seen on this website.) The fire escape which is scheduled to be rebuilt (or even enclosed in the building - this is not clear from the designs) is currently right outside my bedroom window. I have owned this property for 9 years and bought it partly because it was not overlooked at the back despite the built-up nature of the neighbourhood. If this construction were permitted, my curtains would have to stay closed all day to protect my privacy, something which would significantly affect my use of my property (in which I spend a significant portion of each day: it is not a 'second home'). The blocking of the light would not only massively affect my enjoyment of what is currently a light and airy flat: it would also increase my heating bills due to lack of warming from the sun. Then there is the increased noise to contend with: the development would increase the density of population here to an unacceptable extent, and its proximity to my bedroom would mean lost sleep as well. This development, to sum up, is a badly thought-out idea which should be left on the drawing-board. I definitely object.
