The mansard roof applied for originally was turned down. The new application suggests the appearance is of a Georgian style three floor building with end gables on the East and West sides. The top of the mansard roof will be nearly half a metre higher than the original roof. The two end gables will be very overpowering to the residences of Fairfax Place, and Goldhurst Terrace and will be about the same height as the white awning that currently surrounds the scaffold. This is very overpowering. In addition the brick colours will be different as it is no longer possible to get this colour of the old Victorian bricks. This will give the building end-gables the appearance of a multi-coloured monstrosity. This is a conservation area and there are no similar Georgian buildings in the area. It will be an eye sore. The planning statement states that the house will be improved by its Georgian appearance. This may be true elsewhere but not in this Conservation Area location. Three dormer windows will be on the north and south aspect. The three south facing dormer windows will be high and see round the end-gable of Coalyard Mews overlooking all the gardens of Coalyard Mews, Fairfax Place and Goldhurst Terrace looking South. The three north facing dormer windows will fully overlook the rest of 109 Goldhurst Terrace and the gardens to the north in Fairfax Place. Unless the windows nearest to Fairfax Place and Goldhurst Terrace and the north and south gardens of Fairfax Place will be overlooked. This roof which will have an angle of 70 degrees and protruding dormer windows will take considerable light, especially evening light, out of the gardens of 9, 11 and 13 Fairfax Place as well as 111 Goldhurst Terrace and will be a very overpowerin
