- 1 You are advised that condition 2 of planning permission granted on the 28th April 2006 (ref: 2006/1069/P) requires the submission of details of all new doors. You are reminded that the detailed design of the new retail and residential entrance doors pursuant to the remaining part of condition 2 are outstanding and require details to be submitted to and approved by the Council.
- 2 You are advised that the additional information shown on the Hirsh Jewellers shopfront visual and drawing no. 1367_AL(0)004, submitted as part of this application, does not correspond with the approved drawings nor addresses the wording of condition 2. The proposed works are considered materially different from those approved and can only be assessed as part of a new planning application.

You are further advised that the works to modify the Hatton Garden shop frontage shown on the shopfront visual and 1367_AL(0)004 are considered to harm the character and appearance of the shop frontage and are therefore unlikely to be considered supported by the Council.
