While we have no objection to the addition, which we acknowledge would restore symmetry to the original building, we very much regret the loss of side garden space. The sense of buildings in generous gardens – a sense of openness and space – was represented in these villas which, while not part of the original scheme for Regent's Park, reflected the aspirations of buildings set in landscape, distinguished from terraces and linked villas of the types constructed more generally in Primrose Hill.

We object to the addition of the rear stair at the location proposed. The stair is particularly obtrusive, and again diminishes the sense of the building in its garden space. The stair could, we suggest, be located to the side of the projecting rear bay, reducing its impact without loss of function.
