					I write to object at the second rehash of these plans for 109 Goldhurst Terrace.	
					Having previously paid no heed whatsoever to planning permission by beginning works to the building without applying for any, the developer has compounded that offence to local residents by plonking a mock-Georgian monolith of a building in the middle of a Victorian and Edwardian style area.	
					Specifically, the roof of this building will be half a metre higher than the original, with unsightly 70 degree angled eaves interrupted by 6 extruding dormers. It is already, and would be an extraordinary eyesore once completed. I have no idea why the Council would accede to a building so clearly out of keeping with neighbouring houses and yet devoid of any architectural merit.
