# **Design and Access Statement**

### 1 Introduction and Planning Background

This statement has been prepared on behalf of Oh Lola for the propose works to the existing façades at 58 Hatton Garden. The building is in a Conservation Area.

### 2 The Property and its context

The Subject of this report is provide a clear idea about the project which will be developed for the Client at the below address. The main idea of this concept is to develop a paellas Spanish restaurant with a new and fresh approach. ### 3 Detailed Design Considerations

The proposal comprises replacement of 2x existing fascia and 2x existing projecting signs.

The installation of 2 new timber fascia sign, and 1 new internally illuminated projecting sign.

#### Front doors

Existing timber doors and windows to be painted in black colour.

#### **FACADE**

Existing front shop facade to be painted in sand colour.

Existing grille above the entrance door at Hatton Garden to be removed.

Existing extraction grille above entrance at Hatton Wall to be removed.

## 4 Description and Design
