The fact that Abacus has a policy of no cars is not credible - on wet or snowy days, parents are going to drive their children 1-2 miles from their homes and cause massive congestion. Other parents will just drive every day - there is nothing to prevent them from doing so. The application makes no effort to demonstrate the impact of more cars. In addition, this will increase pollution and increase parking chaos in the area which is already very bad. Camden has a policy of prohibiting development that will further increase traffic in and out Hampstead and this development is likely to cripple all of the nearby roads including Thurlow, Pilgrims Lane, Pond St and others.
