Refusal of Non Material Amendments to planning permission

Proposal: Amendment of condition 31 (to allow discharge of the conditions prior to the commencement of below-ground works) of planning permission 2014/1617/P dated 18/02/16 for demolition of existing building and redevelopment for a 24 storey building and a part 7 part 5 storey building comprising a total of 184 residential units (Class C3) and up to 1,041sqm of flexible retail/financial or professional or afé/restaurant floorspace (Classes A1/A2/A3) inclusive of part sui generis floorspace for potential new London Underground station access fronting Avenue Road and up to 1,350sqm for community use (class D1) with associated works including enlargement of existing basement level to contain disabled car parking spaces and cycle parking, landscaping and access improvements.

Reason for Refusal

The proposed amendments by reason of enabling demolition to commence prior to relevant details being approved to enable the development to proceed, would result in the risk of significant harm to visual amenity and the amenities of neighbouring occupiers and therefore cannot be considered 'non-material' to the original planning



permission 2014/1617/P granted 18/02/2016.
