1 Reasons for granting permission.

The proposed samples correspond with the approved drawings and would be of high quality and incorporate materials such as reclaimed brown glazed bricks and London stocks, which would preserve the character and appearance of the high status conservation area. The details would retain the high quality contemporary



appearance of the house and would satisfactorily preserve the character and appearance of the building and area. It is recommended the details be discharged
