| | | | | | I object to externally illuminated fascia sign to Tower Court elevation, externally illuminated fascia and externally illuminated projecting signs to Earlham Street elevation. |
| | | | | | This is a listed building. Other buildings in Earlham Street do not have illuminated signs (note the curry house next door and Le Coq Sportif opposite are currently undergoing investigations with Camden council since neither have permission). |
| | | | | | The illuminated signs are highly inappropriate for the area, and even moreso given they are on a listed building. Whether a fascia sign or a projecting sign, no advertising illuminations should be permitted in Earlham Street. |
| | | | | | I also object to the awning onto Earlham Street. Again, no buildings in this part of Earlham Street have awnings (note that Caffe Nero at the roundabout is in Monmouth Street). There is a hot meat stall that operates outside the premises and the smell from this already causes enormous distress to residents of Fielding Court, the awning will further channel these kebab smells towards the residents above. The building also projects further into Earlham Street than other buildings in the block, and overpowering this space with an awning is highly inappropriate for the location and particularly given it is a listed building. |
| | | | | | I object to the air conditioning units unless they have an automatic cut-off between the hours of 2300 and 0700 or more. |
| | | | | | I strongly object to any attempt to apply for tables and chairs on Earlham Street. There is no space to do so, this has never happened before, and there is no space for them under Camden guidelines anyway on this narrowed pavement. |
| | | | | | I object to any attempt to widen the space for tables and chairs on Tower Court. As a resident when the prior well-behaved tea house requested tables and chairs in Tower Court I did not object as long as the space taken up was small, but I will strongly object to any further encroachment into the shared space in the alleyway. |
