2016/1324/P 31 Windmill Street proposed new shopfront

Thanks for ringing us this morning. I have checked the application and confirm that the BCAAC objects to the application on two counts:

- a) the ventilation grill and mechanical exhaust at street level (as we have previously advised) is likely to be a nuisance (noise and draft) and is visually unacceptable.
- b) the style of the proposed shopfront. The building is a neo-classical probably late Victorian or Edwardian brick structure with stucco quoins and window embellishments, the mechanistic style of the proposed shopfront with predominantly horizontal mullions and curved corners is completely alien to the host building and to the character of the Conservation Area. The existing shopfront, though plain, is considerably more appropriate.
