## Limitations of Survey

Surveys have not been carried out with regard to the presence and condition of asbestos within the buildings.

All services commented upon have been visually inspected but testing has not been carried out and the opinions expressed have been those of a Surveyor and not an Engineer.

The Surveyor has commented on the condition of the services, if further testing or confirmation is required this should be carried out by an Engineer of the relevant discipline.

We carried out only a visual inspection. This means that we do not take up carpets floor covering or floorboards, move furnitures or remove the contents of cupboards.

The inspection was to determine the existing damages, defects and visual condition of the elements.

Bloomsbury Theatre. This appears to be expansion damage. The fracture starts on basement level on the second trend and runs up approximately 1.5 meters and then it hairline fracture diagonally off to the right hand side. There is also a hairline fracture above the centre light fitting running across the bottom of the stairs – photographs have been taken but due to the fracture being hairline it is not very clear to see. On the half landing opposite the window there is further diagonal fracture which appears to be fresh, this approximately 1 to 2mm at its worse point and runs underneath the light on the half landing. Over towards the right hand side to the sort of flight of stairs leading up. It should be noted that the temporary site lighting has been secured to the wall loosely with plugs. Moving on to the half landing by the large window, there is slight marking above the light fittings, possibly due to heat marks. Above the window on this half landing there is a minor fracture to the left hand side of the arch. This runs from the open unit of the arch to the return of the floor support, this is hairline fractures and has minor short 10 to 20mm hairline fractures coming off of it. Along this wall there is hairline fractures to the wall which would turn to the corner elevation of the building. However it should be noted that there is construction works including ground removal on the external wall of this area. It is recommended that a further survey once those works have been undertaken is carried out to ensure that the extent to the cracking movement prior to further construction works. To the wall internally abutting the refectory there is minor hairline fractures to the plaster work. These run from the skirting board detail to the timber sill detail and are of

To the columns opposite the Japanese garden there are small hair line fractures to the columns plaster work at approximately 2meteres high, it should be noted that there is scaffolding to the other side of the windows away from the Japanese garden with extensive construction works going on outside. Decoration	On both sides there are at high level, on these low level sections there is water staining and water damage to the painted plaster in most of the bays. This is due to flat roofs crumbling above and allowing water to ingress. Across all the ribs on the ceiling on the main vaulted section there is small hairline fractures at high level and on the main ribs. This is particularly noticeable for the rib furthest away from main section of the Wilkins building.

	there are numerous hairline fractures throughout the ceiling which



Other	Moving up to the library on the 1 <sup>st</sup> floor this double storey height with an in accessibly terrace either side of it. The external terrace roof section will be picked up in the externals. It should be noted that this building is part of the original 1800s building and is constructed to suite it has had major reworking over the time of its life.		1447 - 1931

Entrance to the library is via the ground floor through a newly inserted polished stone stair case with glass balustrades. The stairwell is double height with a half landing, has a painted plaster ceiling with decorative coving at high level and to the half landing painted plaster walls and the polished down flooring follows throughout. Inset into the landing is a inbuilt display cabinet with glass run and glass shells, paint work has minor scuff marks but no signs of fractures or other disturbance. Opposite the half landing is a decorative arch window with a timber frame, and there is no damage to frame or window surround. It should be noted that there was a scaffold structure externally and consideration should be taken to review the area once the scaffold structure has been removed.

On the first floor there is a large double height oval room with decorative plaster work finishes and motifs around the building with dental detail. Half way onto a dome it should be noted that the dome is in good condition and no cracks or movement is noted. Within the central floor area the open dome has been enclosed by a glass case and a statue has been placed on top. 1935 - 1951

As a side note the anti-room to the double height oval room there were fractures at high level in the corners and historic signs of either water ingress or previous movement. On the opposite side of the UCL oval room again there are signs of water ingress to the external elevation, no other signs of movement at higher level. There are general hairline fractures to be expected with a building of this age. Can we delete that section that there are no hairline fractures at high level on the opposite door opening there are minor hairline fractures to plaster finishes at high level that run through the coving and onto the ceiling. These are 1-2mm wide which should be noted.

Going into the main library you walk up a short flight of timber treads, these are worn but are in good condition. The treads have a central hand rail. Within the anti library space there is a cross passage at high level this area was not inspected. There is an antiroom off this passage which is made of plaster board ceiling which has shrinkage, cracks fitting to plaster board cracks, painted plaster boards which have general scuff marks and require general painting. There is also evidence of water ingress above the right hand door if you look from the anti room to the library and this has been tracked along the door head and across the ceiling. Side note: This small room is access to the lift. There is small hairline fracture between the wall and the ceiling above the arch way which give you views towards the open staircase bar. The floor is polished stone clads.




