					My house overlooks the mechanical plant that is
					1. More visible than what was there before by a factor of 4. There are now 5 plant units as opposed to 1.
					2. Far more noisy than what was there before
					3. So noisy that it has had significant detrimental effect to my enjoyment of life. I can no longer sleep or enjoy a meal with a window open ( my bedroom and dining room oberlook the units). I have taken sound level readings of 78/82 dB
					4. These plant units have significant detrimental effect on the view of Georgian city scape
					5. The plant also has significantly reduced the value of the rent on the first floor flat that I own and rent by causing noise and in effect destroying the view from the rear balcony.
					I am unhappy with the design / noise and lack of consultation. All round badly managed. I have spoken with them and some progress made in one fan - but no thought to the bigger solution I'd hope any planning permission includes specified noise levels and times that equipment can run. I'd also hope something can be done to reduce the visual impact of the plan - it's very ugly to be overlooked by a conservation area and listed buildings.
