					I am writing to you concerning the above planning application and the business impact that this will have on Air Studios.
					I am the Managing Director of Air-Edel Associates Ltd and we represent many of the world's leading film/tv/games composers. I have worked in this business for nearly forty years and have been responsible for the music production of many extremely high profile feature films for both European clients and all the Hollywood Studios including 'Brave', 'The Boxtrolls', 'Gladiator', 'Atonement', 'Harry Potter and the Goblet of Fire'.
					As a music producer/music supervisor I am responsible for all aspects of the budgeting for the recording and mixing work and the overseeing of all sessions including taking responsibility for ensuring that the project is completed within budget.
					The music recording and mixing budget for just one major feature film is often in excess of £350,000 with the majority of these costs being spent on hiring musicians and singers together with the cost of the studio time. Air Studios will often be working on three or four projects simultaneously in the building.
					Central to every recording session is the requirement that we can work in an environment where there is no external noise. For a recording session with orchestra it is quite usual that there are over 50 microphones simultaneously recording the sound from the instruments. If there is any external sound the recording has to be repeated to ensure that we have a 'clean take'.
					The recording day is generally divided into 'sessions' which are typically $10am - 1pm$ , $2pm - 5pm$ , $6pm - 9pm$ . During each session there is massive pressure on the musicians, singers, engineers and composer to use the recording time as efficiently as possible. Any retake required because of external noise is extremely annoying to everyone and if there are repeated interruptions this may result in not all

the music being completed within the session which then has a significant impact on the budget.

During the mixing process the recordings are listened to intently in case of any noise that may have been missed on the recording session. Particularly on a feature film a small noise, when played on massive speakers in the cinema, becomes larger than life!

When booking a studio, it is understood that the company will be able to provide first class facilities including a totally quiet environment to work in. If there is any information that indicates that this cannot be provided it would not be possible for us to book that studio.

A major building project next door to the studio would mean that all the studios within Air Lyndhurst Hall would have to shut for the entire duration of the work. Even the work that builders call 'quiet' in music production terms is the opposite. The sound of builders shouting on site, drilling, movement of vehicles, hammering etc. are all too disruptive to allow recording and mixing work to continue.

If Air Lyndhurst Studios shut for a long period, this would mean that it was not economic to continue the business. With no income to pay the general overhead of the building (rent, rates, light, heat, repairs etc) it would force the owners to shut down and the business would be lost forever. This would mean long term harm not only to the business for Air Lyndhurst but also for the UK musicians, singers and the UK recording industry in general as producers would seek other large recording and mixing facilities elsewhere in Europe.

A number of my clients have already voiced concerns about booking time in advance at the Air Lyndhurst as they are aware of the pending building work. This is a major problem. I am currently working on major projects which we will be recording in 2017 and 2018 and we need to be able to ensure that the studio can provide the facilities that will be required including quiet!

Air Lyndhurst is a unique building. I was very privileged to work with Sir George Martin and spoke with him frequently at the time when he was looking to find a site to relocate Air Studios to from their original premises at Oxford Circus. It was a very long search! The cost of restoring the building and then equipping it as studios was massive. Since 1991 when Air Lyndhurst opened many of the local businesses have benefited from this significant investment. The British recording industry has benefited from having such wonderful facilities to record in. The British musicians and singers have benefited from the work that has been attracted to the studios. It is extraordinary to think that this may be brought to an end. The consequence of the proposed building work would bring significant harm to the entire British recording industry.

					I am the Managing Director of Air-Edel Associates Ltd and we represent many of the world's leading film/tv/games composers. I have worked in this business for nearly forty years and have been responsible for the music production of many extremely high profile feature films for both European clients and all the Hollywood Studios including 'Brave', 'The Boxtrolls', 'Gladiator', 'Atonement', 'Harry Potter and the Goblet of Fire'.
					As a music producer/music supervisor I am responsible for all aspects of the budgeting for the recording and mixing work and the overseeing of all sessions including taking responsibility for ensuring that the project is completed within budget.
					The music recording and mixing budget for just one major feature film is often in excess of £350,000 with the majority of these costs being spent on hiring musicians and singers together with the cost of the studio time. Air Studios will often be working on three or four projects simultaneously in the building.
					Central to every recording session is the requirement that we can work in an environment where there is no external noise. For a recording session with orchestra it is quite usual that there are over 50 microphones simultaneously recording the sound from the instruments. If there is any external sound the recording has to be repeated to ensure that we have a 'clean take'.
					The recording day is generally divided into 'sessions' which are typically $10am - 1pm$ , $2pm - 5pm$ , $6pm - 9pm$ . During each session there is massive pressure on the musicians, singers, engineers and composer to use the recording time as efficiently as possible. Any retake required because of external noise is extremely annoying to everyone and if there are repeated interruptions this may result in not all

the music being completed within the session which then has a significant impact on the budget.

During the mixing process the recordings are listened to intently in case of any noise that may have been missed on the recording session. Particularly on a feature film a small noise, when played on massive speakers in the cinema, becomes larger than life!

When booking a studio, it is understood that the company will be able to provide first class facilities including a totally quiet environment to work in. If there is any information that indicates that this cannot be provided it would not be possible for us to book that studio.

A major building project next door to the studio would mean that all the studios within Air Lyndhurst Hall would have to shut for the entire duration of the work. Even the work that builders call 'quiet' in music production terms is the opposite. The sound of builders shouting on site, drilling, movement of vehicles, hammering etc. are all too disruptive to allow recording and mixing work to continue.

If Air Lyndhurst Studios shut for a long period, this would mean that it was not economic to continue the business. With no income to pay the general overhead of the building (rent, rates, light, heat, repairs etc) it would force the owners to shut down and the business would be lost forever. This would mean long term harm not only to the business for Air Lyndhurst but also for the UK musicians, singers and the UK recording industry in general as producers would seek other large recording and mixing facilities elsewhere in Europe.

A number of my clients have already voiced concerns about booking time in advance at the Air Lyndhurst as they are aware of the pending building work. This is a major problem. I am currently working on major projects which we will be recording in 2017 and 2018 and we need to be able to ensure that the studio can provide the facilities that will be required including quiet!

Air Lyndhurst is a unique building. I was very privileged to work with Sir George Martin and spoke with him frequently at the time when he was looking to find a site to relocate Air Studios to from their original premises at Oxford Circus. It was a very long search! The cost of restoring the building and then equipping it as studios was massive. Since 1991 when Air Lyndhurst opened many of the local businesses have benefited from this significant investment. The British recording industry has benefited from having such wonderful facilities to record in. The British musicians and singers have benefited from the work that has been attracted to the studios. It is extraordinary to think that this may be brought to an end. The consequence of the proposed building work would bring significant harm to the entire British recording industry.

Thank you for your letter of 23rd June 2016 concerning the planning application for 11 Rosslyn Hill, London NW3 5UL - Application Ref 2015/2089/P and Associated Refs 2015/2109/L, 2015/7079/P and 2015/7300/L.

I have again read this latest planning application most carefully to see if any new consideration has been given to the business conducted at the neighboring property of Air Recording Studios. Notwithstanding that the second basement to the west of the property has been removed from the proposal, the planned work would still generate the level of noise and disturbance that would prevent any work taking take place in the studios for the entire duration of the work. Furthermore many of the clients who use Air Studios will not take the chance of booking work at the studio whilst this threatening plan is pending, a great proportion of these clients bring work into the UK from abroad. As I have stated in my earlier objections, this will have the effect of driving this work away from the UK due to the fact that Air Recording Studios and Abbey Road Recording Studios are the only studios in the UK fully equipped to record fully scored film music tracks and it is vital that both these studios are able to operate simultaneously. The effects of this building proposal will be felt much farther afield than Rosslyn Hill, London NW3. I cannot overstate the permanent harm that this development would lever on the entire music recording industry in this country, laying waste to a very distinguished and proud industry which has been the leader in international commercial music production for many decades, destroying the livelihood of so many musicians, composers, engineers, management teams, hoteliers, score writers, co-ordinators, and the wider community of trades in the borough and countrywide that support the many visiting production teams.

I here enclose a copy of my previous objection dated 26th September 2016 which still stands in all details to again object most strongly to this latest planning application Ref 2015/2089/P for 11 Rosslyn Hill, London NW3 5UL.

"As a self employed musician working in the commercial music business I write to lodge the strongest possible objection to this application for underground development to the property at 11 Rosslyn Hill, London NW3 5UL. This property is adjacent to Air Recording Studios which has for over 20 years been the foremost recording studio with capacity to record full orchestral music scores for film and all genres of recorded music in London. Founded by Sir George Martin, of Beatles fame, this studio was set up to be of the very highest standard and has maintained that quality of output consistently throughout the years. The English commercial music business is of unparalleled quality

throughout the world and earns huge amounts of revenue for this country. It is admired and revered worldwide and all of the larger orchestral scores are delivered from the only two operating London studios of sufficient capacity, that is Air Lyndhurst and Abbey Road. The effect of noise from the machinery excavating and constructing basement accommodation to 11 Rosslyn Hill will eliminate any chance of any work being conducted at the studio, which works twenty four hours a day, for the entire duration of the project. Such is the nature of commercial music production that an interval of this duration will force production companies to record their scores elsewhere and having made that move, very many will not then return to England at all.

This application, if successful, will with one stroke, close down an enormously important international industry that employs many thousands of people from the composers to the musicians, engineers, management, hoteliers, score writers, co-ordinators, and the wider community of trades in the borough and countrywide that support the many visiting production teams; this amounts to many billions of pounds of annual revenue.

London's reputation as the primary recording centre of the world will be permanently damaged and this will result, for the great majority of us, in a loss of up to at least 50% if not a great deal more of our work and thus our income. Furthermore our incomes would probably not recover once the works have been completed as we will have lost too many of our clients to international competitors. This constitutes real harm. There would also be job lay-offs for staff and highly qualified studio technicians at Air. I believe the proposed works or any similar at the aforementioned property would put not only the future of the studio in jeopardy, but also the livelihoods of hundreds of musicians whose skill and expertise attracts a significant amount of contracts from both the UK and overseas.

Even the threat of it has caused clients I work with in the USA to be nervous and say things like "so we can only record at Abbey Road now?". As one who has attended hundreds of orchestral sessions and has extensive experience in acoustics, the report the applicants submitted claiming no noise will be audible is ludicrous. They are wrong. The fact that they would likely not assume liability for being wrong, in the event they are wrong, should tell you all you need to know. If I book a session at Air, may I sue them if there is any noise? I'm sure you"ll realize that I probably can"t. "Experts" who have nothing on the line financially in the equation, can say pretty much anything without fear of repercussions. Bear this in mind.
					Due to the irreparable damage this will cause the British music industry, not to mention numerous musicians careers, and a long established company, this application is so vastly against the public interest that it must be denied. If you approve the application, and noise does shut down Air Studios, Camden will receive the kind of negative publicity from which one does not easily recover, but nobody will shed a tear for politicians and civil servants. They will however for a jewel in the history of recorded music.
