1 Reasons for approval-

The combined heat and power unit (CHP) stack in the top tower, including its height and location relative to air inlets, is considered acceptable in terms of noise and air quality by the Council's Sustainability Officer.



The full impact of the proposed development has already been assessed. The proposed details would not have a harmful impact on the appearance of the host buildings and streetscene or on neighbouring amenity.

As such, the proposed details are in general accordance with policies CS5, CS7 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy, and policies DP12, DP26, DP28 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.
