I wish to object to this planning application for change of use from D1 to B1.

Firstly, this premise has never operated as an art gallery, its current planning category, which would have been a welcome addition to Kentish Town Road. It has dirty curtains covering all the windows so that I have no idea what happens there. When the premise was refurbished, the builder told me that the owner and family were to live there. That I could believe by its current appearance. Since refurbishment it has always had a shop front name board saying "xxxx Phonographic Services" so I wonder why after all these years the application for B1 – "audio mastering and sound recording facility" has been made. As I am currently away I am unable to give the part of the name xxx, but I only just realised that objections need to be sent by today.

Secondly I believe B1 use would cause unnecessary noise in a partly residential area.
