Kathryn,

We've asked PRP to confirm the areas and in typical fashion they've gone and done a proper number on it. The results are attached for info. We anticipate a few minor differences with the numbers and the attached broadly correlates with your figures. Hopefully the clarity of the plan and table is more help than if we were to send over a set of figures.

As to the S106, we would need to retain flexibility in some of the HoTs – for example (corresponding with the numbering of your bullets):

- A contribution of £600,000 towards local sports facilities Definition of 'local' will need to be considered in further detail
- Enhancement of the existing tennis facilities in agreement with Kenlyn Tennis
 Club Enhancement of tennis facilities this may be better phrased as being KTC or the community tennis club
- Management/Maintenance Plan for the site including the open space No comment
- Provision of 11 affordable flats; 6 social rented and 5 intermediate That is per submission
- Sustainability Plan No comment
- Construction Management Plan No comment
- Basement Construction Plan No comment
- Car capped We would need to consider the wording of this as it is likely to cause us concern in the context of the need to revise the position through S.73 application to follow
- A contribution of £40,000 towards Pedestrian, Cycling and Environmental Improvements – had this been discussed previously as I can't recall it? Wouldn't this be covered by CIL, so making it vulnerable?
- Requirement to work to a target of 20% local recruitment, advertise all
 construction vacancies and work placement opportunities exclusively with the
 King's Cross Construction Skills Centre for a period of 1 week before marketing
 more widely, specified number (to be agreed) of construction work placement
 opportunities of not less than 2 weeks each, to be undertaken over the course of
 the development, to be recruited through the Council's Kings Cross Construction
 Skills Centre No comment
- If the build costs of the scheme exceed £3 million the applicant must recruit 1 construction apprentice per £3million of build costs, and pay the council a support fee of £1,500 per apprentice as per clause 8.17 of CPG8. Recruitment of construction apprentices should be conducted through the Council's Kings Cross Construction Skills Centre No comment
- If the value of the scheme exceeds £1million, the applicant must also sign up to the Camden Local Procurement Code, as per section 8.19 of CPG8 – No comment
- The applicant provide a local employment, skills and local supply plan setting out their plan for delivering the above requirements in advance of commencing on site – No comment

Where we've provided no comment at this stage, this wouldn't preclude the need for comments once the draft is provided.

I know I have raised this previously and you said it is not possible to provide adult fitness equipment in the main lawn area given the children's play equipment is to be located there but is there any scope for the fitness equipment on the other green area freed up by the reduced parking? "There has been no inclusion of simple adult fitness equipment. We would welcome further consideration of ways this could be incorporated into the scheme to maximise the health benefits of this new public open space."
