The present building dates back to 1877 when the area had major redevelopment to provide for a road between Oxford Street and Charring Cross. This made available land which was bought and built upon by Sir Charles Wyndham, the famous Actor Manager, and so began the traditions of theatre land with the Wyndham and Albery Theatres named after the owner and stepson respectively.
