The applicant has not investigated the noise impact of the proposed external A/C condensing units on the residents of Russell Square Mansions, which adjoins and overlooks the proposed 3 sites. It is essential to measure residential impact from the 3 sites to the rear of Russell Square Mansions as there is far less background noise compared to Cosmo Place. However, even further, fully enclosed acoustic shields may not be sufficient to reduce 24 hour noise.  Then there is the problem of the enormous size of these units. Even the smallest 2 unit structure would be 2100mm wide and 1958 high (+400mm, ie.2358 high with an acoustic shield of the size proposed for the 6 unit site). This would change the view from my flat from residential slate roof and church spire to something more industrial.  I ask you please to reject this application on the grounds of excessive noise and size of proposed plant and inappropriate siting of it.

My bedroom is at the rear of our building, adjacent to the Cosmo Place side of the hotel and opposite the spur. Noise will thus be heard from both rooftops, and will likely be exacerbated by reflection back off the proposed acoustic screen. I am surprised that the planners did not consider the effect of the installation on neighbouring residents.  On the grounds of unacceptable noise nuisance I urge that this application be rejected.
