I made the mistake then of not objecting to the planning application for the extension which caused a substantial loss of light to my rear bedroom and backyard. It also caused a substantially reduced and impaired outlook from my kitchen and back yard where previously I had a very pleasant view to the west extending along the rear of the buildings on the terrace into the distance. The privacy barrier and safety rail of the proposed new terrace will extend and increase the height of the topmost point of the extension and will thus further impair the outlook from my flat. |   |
