					Café Noir have been running the Shisha tent for some time and I have had occasion, more than once, to call the noise patrol at night as they have been playing music out there (late, around midnight) which because the tent backs on to gardens of residential properties (such as hours) causes significant noise (and at night, sleep) disturbance and nuisance.			
					The application itself does not state what hours the Shisha tent will be open or whether they plan to have any music or sound (radio, tv or other music) outside – which is a key issue in terms of noise nuisance in a residential setting. I would have very serious objections if the plan was to have the garden open after 6pm (normal café opening hours) and also if there were any sound systems of any description (e.g. radio, TV, stereo) at any time as the noise from this would cause serious nuisance to us in living and working in close proximity. The Shisha Tent is currently advertised as being open from 4pm but with no end time which is a cause for concern.			
					The application cites the fact that there is already a 24 hour nisa and other late night takes open on York Way as a precedent, suggesting that to add the Shisha tent into this environ make any difference. I beg to differ. We are already suffering from late night noise and a behavior and activity in this vicinity and to add yet another late night premise for the pur smoking and shisha will not help. However there is also a key difference with these prem Shisha tent actually backs onto gardens (not the street) so the noise has a much greater ne on residents (like us). As it stands the application is not nearly detailed enough about many aspects of the proposal. Opening hours? sound systems? Capacity? What will be served there? Will it be licensed? Are there toilets on the premises? (we already have many of the visitors to the premises on York Way using Camden Mews as a public urinal at all hours of the day and night so this is a very real concern).

The only way that this application might be acceptable is if all of the following are included as conditions (and followed through):

- it is only open normal café hours (i.e. 9am-6pm)
- there is no amplified sound in the outside area (no screens, stereo, radio, tv etc)
- there are toilets on the premises (there may be but the application doesn't tell us)
- the green roof is implemented
