1 Reasons for granting permission

The proposal seeks to discharge condition 12 of planning permission 2013/7338/P, dated 10/10/2014, which sought details of the location and extent of photovoltaic cells to be installed on the building. Revised details and extra clarification has been provided during the course of the application. The number of solar pv panels, and their siting, are considered to be acceptable in order for the proposed development to provide adequate on-site renewable energy facilities. The details submitted to discharge condition 12 are considered to be acceptable.

The full impact of the proposed development has already been assessed.

The proposed development is in general accordance with Policy CS13 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy, and Policy DP22 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.

2 You are reminded that condition 18 (remediation measures) of planning permission 2013/7338/P, dated 10/10/2014, still needs to be approved. An application has been submitted (2016/4069/P) and is currently under consideration.
