Since the work has already taken place I can testify that my neighbours have disturbed me on several occasions as they now enter and leave their flat underneath my bedroom window often coming and going late at night. This was never the case when their front door was on the other side of the staircase. I appreciate their desire for convenience with their children but this need is temporary and moving the door will act as a permanent disturbance to my quality of life, as it already has done on several occasions. The front of the house is clearly visible from the street, contrary to their assertion on the application. The front of the house and front garden are, and have always been, communal and it seems that in addition to moving their front door there is a desire to co opt this space for their usage, including the communal cupboard that would be next to their front door if moved. I strongly object to this. I have repeatedly tried to engage my neighbours and their architect about this issue and they have refused to discuss it. They told be the new door was on plans they showed me in March but I did not notice. I don't understand why they would wait until now, when the work is finished, to apply for a variance in planning and risk the costs of rectifying the works unless they believe it less likely that planning would rule against them. This seems to be an improper way of going about the process. The front of the house should remain an open, clear communal space, accessible to all. Moving the front door will cause considerable noise disruption to my flat as my bedroom overlooks the front garden and I would not have bought the flat knowing a family would be accessing their front door right underneath it.
