					1) I am very concerned that the removal of tree (T13) will have a significant impact on the garden setting that we currently experience. This tree largely shields us from the presence of the building beyond (end terrace wall of no 30 Maud Wilkes). I appreciate the efforts made by the designers to make the building fit into its surroundings (with the 'green corridor' and the 'climbing plants'), however removing this tree will damage our outlook, by changing it from a leafy oasis, to a view of the buildings that lie beyond our garden.

Although the plans suggest that these issues have been considered, I would like to make sure that this does not get compromised if there are any further changes to the plans (I assume this is not possible once the planning decision has been made but just want to make sure).
