The current building is one of a number of houses in Redington Road of the same period. The house has a number of very fine features that are typical of the Arts and Crafts style. The removal of the yellow render would greatly enhance the building by revealing the characteristic brickwork of the period. The plans indicate a large increase in the footprint in order to accommodate eight flats on this site. The extensive earthworks to build the proposed five storey building with underground parking for 7 cars involves extending into the rear garden and felling no fewer than 7 trees, thereby threatening the root base of all the other nearby trees. Our environment depends on trees to counteract the pollution that has already exceeded safety limits for our area. We cannot afford to permit yet another loss of green space. It is the large gardens and large trees that characterise Hampstead and make it an attractive area in which to live. A number of us are deeply concerned that Camden Planning Officers are not listening to the wishes of residents, whose rates pay the planning officers' salaries. Instead they find favour with the developers, whose only interest is financial and who will not be living in the neighbourhood can ill afford to lose another fine, Hampstead, Arts and Crafts style dwelling.
