Mornington Crescent is a residential street which is already disturbed by the recycling and rubbish facilities at the back of Greater London House and the constant flow of deliveries to the building. An expanded office space would inevitably mean many more vehicles coming to deliver to the building. It would also mean much more waste to be disposed of. This would significantly add to the noise levels which we already deal with. The street has many children living on it and is relatively traffic free apart from the flow of vehicles to deliver supplies and collect rubbish and recycling from the office. Any increase would substantially reduce their ability to play safely on the pavement. Hampstead Road is a very polluted road, but Mornington Crescent remains less so. However any increase to heavy goods traffic which would be the inevitable result of the office expansion would be very unwelcome both from a noise and a pollution perspective. I am not convinced by the report's assessment that the effect would be minimal - given that as residents we put up already with a lot of engine noise, and engines left on as deliveries are made, and trucks parked, with their exhaust pipes still chugging out fumes as they make a delivery. The extra building work - ahead of years of proposed building work in the area, because of HS2 - is also extremely unwelcome, and the combined effect will be to damage seriously the noise and peace levels in this residential road significantly. This is a substantial project, which will require an estimated extra 25 trucks to the site while the building work is happening, and this will cause further disruption to a residential street where people shouldn't have to put up with this level of industrial traffic.
