The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

The conservatory extension, by reason of its location, design and scale, is a prominent and incongruous rear addition which is harmful to the character and appearance of the host building, the terrace of adjoining properties and the conservation area, contrary to policy CS14 (Promoting high quality places and conserving our heritage) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy, and policies DP24 (Securing high quality design) and DP25 (Conserving Camden's heritage) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.

The Director of Culture and Environment will instruct the Head of Legal Services to issue an Enforcement Notice alleging a breach of planning control.
