The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** advertisement consent for the following reason(s):

## Reason(s) for Refusal

The proposed free standing internally illuminated signs and internally illuminated projecting sign by reason of their design, size, siting and method of illumination would result in overly dominant and incongruous additions to the parent building, to its detriment and they would be detrimental to the appearance and character of the streetscape and the conservation area, and harmful to the setting of adjacent Listed



buildings contrary to Core Strategy Policies CS5 (Managing the impact of growth) and CS14 (Promoting high quality places and conserving our heritage) and Development Policies DP24 (Securing high quality design), DP25 (Conserving Camden's Heritage) and DP26 (Managing the impact of development on occupiers and neighbours) of Camden's Local Development Framework.
