
- 1 This notice is valid for 2 years from the date of this letter or until the work is completed, whichever is the sooner.
- 2 You are advised that the appropriate standards for tree work are set out in BS 3998: 2010. Failure to ensure that the proposed works are carried out to these standards may result in damage to the tree(s) and may result in legal action by the Council.
- 3 Please note that any approval given by the Council does not give an exemption from the requirements to comply with the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (as



amended), or any other Acts offering protection to wildlife. Of particular note is the protection offered to bats, birds and their nests from construction works. For further information contact Natural England on 0300 060 4911 or www.naturalengland.org.uk.

- 4 You are advised that The Council's decision not to object to the notification does not give permission to damage privately owned property. Should the tree be pruned back to the boundary it could cause significant damage to the tree due to the amount of material that could be removed. This could result in the owner of the tree taking legal action against you.
