					1. Light Nuisance: This is an inappropriate development in a residential area. The 16 lights will be less than 100 feet from our home and project excessive light into the rear rooms of our home until 930 pm. These rooms include two bedrooms, our living room and kitchen. All of these rooms are the ones which we spend our time in as a family during the evenings,
					2. Noise Nuisance: The floodlighting will plainly enable tennis to be played late into the evening and create a noise nuisance. Whilst the current level of noise is acceptable during the day, it would be wholly inappropriate to allow a similar level of noise at night - not just from playing tennis but also from the club house and members entering and exiting the club. The floodlights will allow playing of the courts and use of the club late into the night. This will disturb our quite enjoyment, particularly for our young family.
					3. Eyesore: Although the poles are 6 metres high, it is must not be overlooked that the courts are elevated by 2 -3 metres and therefore they will rise to some 8- 9 metres above street level. This will create an eyesore.
					The West Heath Tennis Club has operated successfully for decades without the need for such extensive lighting, as proposed by this planning application. There is no need to introduce these 16 floodlights at this stage and we would ask that the Council rejects this application.
