Details pursuant to condition 11 (Arboricultural Method Statement) of planning permission reference 2012/3089/P, granted on 02/02/2015, for; "Erection of 7 storey block to provide 17 self-contained residential units (Class C3) (comprising 2 x studio, 5 x 2 bed, 6 x 3 bed and 4 x 4 bed units) with associated roof terraces, plus new vehicular access and basement parking for 17 cars, new pedestrian access, refuse store and substation on front boundary, green roofs, communal open space and landscaping, following demolition of existing nurse' hostel (sui generis)".

1 Reasons for granting permission:

Condition 11 (Tree Protection Measures)
The tree protection measure relating to T4, an off site copper beech, tree are considered to be more robust than those previously detailed. The details submitted



are considered sufficient to demonstrate that the tree protection measures have been correctly installed and implemented and are therefore sufficient to discharge condition 11.

The full impact of the proposed development has already been assessed.

As such, the proposed development is in general accordance with policy CS15 of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy.
