

Finchley Road has been noted by English Heritage (The Conservation Studio, 23.6.14) as worthy of its own Conservation Area. Red brick is well represented, with stone detailing. The buildings on the eastern side of the road feature large rear gardens and mature trees and, because of this, are home to one of Camden's few bat populations. The current design was approved over the years and taking into account minute details, all requests to changes of any element should not be given without full planning permission, independent reports on NO2, noise, sunlight, councillor voting and full consultation.

The proposed changes to the plan are objectionable on the following grounds:

- The planned design would not enhance the conservation area and would form a negative contribution. In conflict with CS 14.12, DP 24.13, DP 24.15, DP 24.19, DP 25.2, DP 25.3, DP 25.8, DP 24.15
- Even larger bulk and scale would be highly disruptive of the sense of rhythm of this residential area. (CS 14, CS 14.25, DP 24.13, DP 24.15, DP 24.19, DP 25.2, DP 25.3, DP 25.8, DP 24.7, DP 24.13, and DP 25)
- The highly visible hard landscaping is no longer proposed to be balance with green roof and is inappropriate for an area noted for its front gardens and susceptibility to flooding (DP 19.8, CS 14.18, DP 23.7, DP 24.1, DP 25.3, DP 19.8, DP 23.7, DP 23.8)
- Insufficient provision of private green space for health and well-being of residents (DP 24.23). Even the minimum required amenity space for future residents is being taken away
