



Dear Mr Remmington,

Further to our meeting at the house earlier this year we have now carried out the reduction work to the rear oak and large horse chestnut at the rear of the garden.

At the time this work was carried out I asked the Tree Surgeon about the horse chestnut that you had commented looked extremely unhealthy. His view which he subsequently confirmed in writing ( extract copy of which is attached to this email) that the tree was in a very bad shape and should be removed.

I therefore request consent from the Council to the removal of the horse chestnut as soon as possible before the winter sets in.

I would also request agreement from the Council to the removal of the hawthorn in the front garden which is an extremely precarious state and could fall at any time. I will replace it with, probably, another hawthorn or a yew or an attractive tree which would not affect the foundations of the house.

We also discussed at our meeting the Cherry in the front garden and it's possible removal. On this subject I will ,if I may, write to you separately in a few days time with accompanying photos etc.

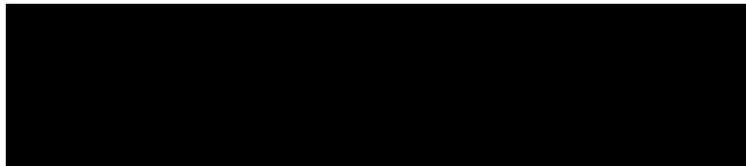
