Subject: 156 West End Lane

Sirs,

As a resident of West End Lane, I object to the proposed new development at 156 West End Lane. My principal ground for objection is that this area of West Hampstead is hugely over-developed already and both the traffic along West End Lane and the pavements outside the three stations have become dangerously overcrowded and will be even more so when the huge development opposite the tube station is occupied.

My second reason for objecting is the loss of amenity by way of loss of light to the open spaces currently available for children to play.

Thirdly, another supermarket is the last thing this area needs. Tesco's lorries and, to a lesser extent, Sainsbury's lorries are one of the main contributors to congestion in WEL.

I hope planning permission will not be granted and that the Council will seek to ensure that any future development on this site will be of a size and nature such as to add value to the local community, rather than to be damaging to the amenity of residents in this area.
