Introduction

The construction Industry operates within an increasingly complex system of legislative permits, consents and approvals. It is essential that these are fully considered and addressed at the earliest stage of each project.

The table lists the primary General Consents and will supplement the Environmental Consents, Licences, Permits and Registrations List contained within Environmental Management Guidance Note 02.

The general consents a list contains the licences or permits that will usually be necessary to acquire in order to carry out routine construction work.
