



PARTITION TYPE LEGEND

- PT1 - Office cross wall
*Single glazed acoustic, 12.8mm Stacip Silence.
Manifestation - see detail drawing.
- PT2 - Corridor glass wall
*Single glazed.
12mm head soaked toughened to the doors.
Manifestation - see detail drawing.
- PT3 - Solid gypsum partition
Details vary - see P-SET drawings.
- PT4 - Partial height solid gypsum partition -
Heights noted on drawing.
- PT5 - 75mm thick solid gypsum partition -
- PT6 - 140mm thick solid gypsum partition to
receive audio visual alcove details. -
- PT7 - Solid gypsum partition with clearstory
glazing above datum line.
- Boxing out to core walls to hide pipes etc.

DB ratings: Generally all to 37db with doors at 32db.

Minimal works proposed to these areas.
