# **Site Description**

The application site is a mid-19<sup>th</sup> century public house located on a prominent corner of Camden High Street and Hawley Street. It provides a termination to the more prosaic terrace to its south and emphasises the corner. The site is not within a conservation area, but is north of the boundary of the Camden Town Conservation Area. The building is not statutorily listed but is identified on Camden's local list as an asset of architectural, townscape and social significance.

### **Assessment**

## 1 Proposal

1.1 Permission is sought for the display of an internally illuminated individual lettering and star symbol signs positioned vertically between 1<sup>st</sup> and 2nd floor front elevation. The sign would measure 2.44m in height x 0.56 width.

# 2 Visual Amenity

- 2.1 Policy CS5 seeks to protect the amenity of Camden's residents by ensuring the impact of development is fully considered
- 2.2 CPG1 Design states that advertisements will only be acceptable at fascia level or below, further stating that advertisements above fascia level can appear visually obtrusive and unattractive, and where illuminated can cause light pollution to neighbouring properties. Also signs that are unsympathetically designed can cause significant harm to the building and local townscape, therefore signs should relate well to the character, scale and architectural features of the building and respect their local context.
- 2.3 In accordance with guidance, if an advertisement is required at high level for a specific business use, this will usually be restricted to non-illuminated images on windows. Whilst the area is characterised with signs positioned above ground floor level, many of these are unique and provide visual interest, and are in keeping with the character of the area and relate to the premises they are displayed on. However, the proposed 'Heineken' lettering and star symbol does not provide any interest of this kind. Rather, the proposal will negatively impact the historical well preserved and important local listing building.
- 2.4 Additionally, the sign would be highly visible from the junctions of Camden High Street and Jamestown Road and also from the pedestrian crossing points at this major junction. It is considered that the location of the proposed signs is not an appropriate/integral feature to this highly prominent elevation.

### 3 Public Safety

3.1 It is not likely the sign would cause any significant harm to public safety and is considered acceptable in this aspect.

#### 4 Conclusion

4.1	The internally illuminated advertisement by reason of its prominent location at second floor level would result in an incongruous addition which would be detrimental to the character and appearance of the host building and street scene.		
5	Recommendation		
	The proposed advert is contrary to policies CS14, DP24 and DP25 of the Local Development Framework and the application is therefore recommended for refusal.
