In this letter you express opposition to the proposed redevelopment of St Anne's Church, Laxton Place. I am the planning officer dealing with the planning application at this site.

As the letter and petition was received some time ago and before the application was submitted, please confirm whether you wish the letter and petition to be registered as an objection to the planning application (ref: 2016/6069/P) at 1 Triton Square and St Anne's Church, Laxton Place submitted 02/11/2016 for:

Erection of 3 storey extension at roof (6th floor) level of 1 Triton Square to provide additional office floorspace (Class B1) with relocated plant above, creation of roof terraces at 6th floor level, reconfiguration of ground floor including infill of Triton Square Mall including flexible retail (A1, A3 and A4), affordable workspace (B1) and reprovision of gym (D2); erection of part 6, part 9 storeys residential building to provide 22 flats (10 x 3-bed, 11 x 2-bed and 1 x 1-bed) (Class C3) following demolition of St Anne's Church; hard and soft landscaping including garden at junction of Longford Street and Triton Square; reconfigured vehicle and pedestrian accesses; and other ancillary works.
