I object to the proposal on the following grounds: 1, loss of a single family dwelling; family sized dwellings need to be protected. 2, height, bulk, detailed design of mansard roof extension. 3, bulk, design and detailing of first floor and rear extension. 4, intensifying occupancy of the site and associated parking, noise and amenity concerns. 5, overlooking: the mansard extension will look directly into our bedroom Parking: this is already a stress area for parking, increasing the number of units will lead to further stress on parking. Design:the existing roof is in its original form, as such its loss is unacceptable in principle. The proposed mansard is poorly designed, particularly in relation to the windows front and back, sheer rear elevation. In detailed design terms the proposed mansard and rear extension relates poorly to the architecture, character and appearance of the host building as well as the character and appearance of the Conservation Area. It is noted that there is a poorly designed roof extension adjacent, however this was installed before the area became a Conservation Area and cannot be considered a suitable precedent.
