1 Reasons for granting permission:

The submitted details of location, design and method of waste storage are considered acceptable and meet the requirements of condition 5. The ventilated rubbish store at basement level will house bagged rubbish until it is ready for collection at street level daily (waste shall be sorted by collection company). Cardboard will be flattened and collected separately.



The proposed development is in general accordance with the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy, with particular regard to policies CS18 and the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies, with particular regard to policies DP12, DP26 and DP28.
