Morrisons Supermarket and Petrol Filling Station, Chalk Farm Road, NW1 8AA

Request for scoping opinion under the town and country planning (EIA) regulations for proposed mixed use redevelopment involving 8 buildings of up to 17 storeys, basement, comprising 600-750 residential units, 8500m2 supermarket, 8000m2 business space, 1800m2 additional retail and petrol filling station, 650m2 leisure floorspace and c.360 car parking spaces, with associated basement, landscaping, provision of open space and alterations to existing road network.

Thank you for referring the above scoping opinion request. You are asked to quote our reference in any future correspondence.

The Environment Agency is a statutory consultee for all applications that are accompanied with an Environmental Impact assessment (EIA). However, the proposal as submitted raises no environmental concerns that are within our remit, so we would have no preference as to which environmental constraints are scoped into the Environmental Statement.

However, as the development involves the decommissioning of a petrol station, we would have the following comments to make:

The Environment Agency recommends the removal of all underground storage tanks (USTs) that are unlikely to be reused and any contamination found should be dealt with accordingly.

All investigations of land potentially affected by contamination should be carried out by or under the direction of a suitably qualified competent person. The competent person would normally be expected to be a chartered member of an appropriate body (such as the Institution of Civil Engineers, Geological Society of London, Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors, Institution of Environmental Management) and also have relevant experience of investigating contaminated sites.
