They provide welcome summer shade, humidification and oxygen and a pleasant scent, and they lessen the force of wind and rain on the rear of Yale Court, but most of all they provide a most welcome privacy screen between the houses and gardens on Crediton Hill and the occupiers of Yale Court, who would otherwise completely overlook the Crediton Hill garden concerned. The trees also provide a most useful sound barrier that lessens the very high noise levels created by the contract gardeners working each week on the adjacent Crediton Hill gardens, using leaf blowers and other high-noise level appliances, and they also cut down the noise from the frequent garden parties being held in summer in Crediton Hill gardens. In addition these trees host several attractive and beneficial mostly insectivorous wild bird species, that I have observed using them, such as Great Spotted Woodpeckers, Goldfinches, Blackcaps, Goldcrests and Titmice.
