The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reason(s):

# Reason(s) for Refusal

## 1 Reason for Refusal:

The proposal is considered to be unacceptable by virtue of its size, design and location. It is too large, too high and too bulky and is an incongruous fixture that is unsuited to the area and is detrimental to the host and adjacent buildings and the



streetscape, and is contrary to policy CS5 (Managing the impact of growth) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy, and policies DP24 (Securing high quality design) and DP26 (Managing the impact of development on occupiers and neighbours) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.

### 2 Reason for Refusal:

The proposal is considered to be unacceptable and detrimental to the amenity of the residents by promoting noise nuisance and light pollution and is contrary to policy CS5 (Managing the impact of growth) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy, and policy DP26 (Managing the impact of development on occupiers and neighbours) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraphs 186 and 187 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
