Hi Laura,

I am putting in an objection to granting retrospective planning permission for the work done on this site.

This building is in a conservation area and the windows should have been replaced with fixtures in character with the building and the area- Edwardian style as I understand it.

Instead the windows that were put in were modern aluminum double-glazed, not therefore appropriate for the building, resulting in a job that was both out of character and which has reduced amenity for the residents. The work in question was also done quite poorly, resulting in drafts and gaps in the windows frame. The fact that the contractor did not apply properly for planning permission at the time, gives credence to the idea of a slap-dash job.

If the Council was under obligation to replace the windows like for like, then a retrospective planning application would validate the work done which would be unacceptable to the residents and the conservation area.
