The evidence submitted is considered sufficient to demonstrate that a Sorbus aria (whitebeam) tree with a girth of 12-14cm has been planted in the rear garden of the application site. The details are sufficient to discharge condition 5 of planning



permission 2013/5372/P dated 09/03/2015.
