1 Reasons for granting consent.

This application seeks to discharge the same details already discharged under the associated listed building consent (ref: 2015/3705/L) approved on 14/09/2015.

The details of the proposed new railings, gates and piers submitted are considered to be acceptable and satisfy the requirements of the condition. The full impact of the proposed development has already been assessed. The proposed details would not have any harmful impact on the appearance of the host buildings, the



streetscene or on neighbouring amenity.
