E.g. Oak (T3) - fell because of excessive shading and low amenity value. Replant with 1 standard ash in the same place.

Front Garden:

T1 & T2: 2 x Mature Lime: Adjacent to the entrance have been regularly maintained. They appear to be causing localised soil disturbance which is moving the boundary wall/ It would certainly be prudent not to allow these trees to exceed their current dimensions. Reduce crowns by 30% ensuring sufficient clearance over neighbouring drive. Thin crown densities by 20-25%. Remove dead wood. Remove basal epicormic growth as is practicable. T3: Robinia: Approximately 4.00m. This potentially very large tree is poorly located. Fell to ground level and remove root ball.

T4: Lilac: Two large limbs which extend over pavement appear to be in decline. Significant amount of dead wood was noted and some broken by high sided vehicles. These factors in conjunction with an obvious obstruction of the pavement lead us to recommend the removal of these two large limbs. Remove dead wood throughout crown and reduce remaining crown by up to 20% to shape and balance.

T5: Pyracantha: Approximately 4.50m. This tree appears unstable and is leaning on the building. Fell to ground level and allow to re-generate. T6: Apple: Previously collapsed. This tree has merit for its aesthetic value and character. The tree is now beginning to layer. Remove dead wood. Reduce crown back to previous reduction points whilst preserving a suitable amount of furnishing growth in order to maintain crown continuity.

7. Identification Of Tree(s) And Description Of Works

- S1: Viburnum: Fell and grub out as is practicable.
- T7: Apple: Adjacent wall. Reduce crown height by approximately 25-30% as general maintenance.

S2: Shrub: Reduce height by 50% and shape.

T8: Pittosporum: Approximately 5.00m. This tree is becoming somewhat tall. Fell the main stem whilst retaining low shrub growth to preserve as a shrub.
